





Oze Ukai: Over a Thousand Years of History

The history of cormorant fishing goes way back: this method of fishing appears to have already been in use around the eighth century, since the name *Ukai* (meaning "cormorant fishing") already appears in a family register from that period preserved at Shoso-in. Cormorant fishing has been protected through the ages by the Imperial Court and those in power at the time. The term usho (meaning "cormorant fishing master") is thought to originate with Oda Nobunaga, and the Tokugawa clan granted them the right to have surnames and carry weapons. In 1890, cormorant fishing was put under the authority of the Imperial Household Agency, and the usho of Oze have continued to work for the Imperial Court as cormorant fishing masters under the Imperial Household Agency's Board of Ceremonies up to the present day as they keep this traditional method of fishing alive.

The Performance

As the boat drifts, you hear the pleasant sound of the limpid river amidst the tranquility. Only the glow of the bonfire provides illumination as cormorants, spurred on by the usho calling out "Ho! Ho!", dive into the water one by one to catch fish. The highlight of Oze cormorant fishing is the *Karikudari*, which lets sightseers view the cormorants up close while getting a good view of the *usho* as they skillfully handle the ropes used to control the cormorants. After the covered viewing boats are brought to shore, passengers get to watch the *ubune* (cormorant fishing boats) perform the *Tsukemise* as they pass by.

Viewing Procedure

- 1 Please arrive at the Seki Yusen Office at least 30 minutes before boarding time.
- 2 When boarding time arrives, you will be shown to your designated viewing boat.
- 3 Your boat will move to an upstream mooring spot and wait a while.

The time spent until the start of cormorant fishing (about 40 minutes) will be used for sightseeing and to hear an *usho* explain cormorant fishing.

Go ahead and eat if you would like to. This is where hotel and Ushonoie guests board.

4 Karikudari cormorant fishing begins. The ubune and viewing boats proceed down the river together.

*If Karikudari is impossible due to river conditions, the viewing boats will stay by the shore and the *ubune* will perform the *Tsukemise* maneuver as they pass by.
